

Available for the first time last year, Clay offers an Entrepreneur program to include Business Law. This is a senior level class, and students will be able to receive 3 hours of high school credit per semester, as well as earn 6 hours of college credit for the year (3 hours for Entrepreneurship and 3 hours for Business law). The dual college credit is offered through Ivy Tech State Community College and is transferable to most state schools within Indiana.

In Entrepreneurship, students will learn how to run and operate their own business. By being the boss, students will learn what it takes to be profitable, develop their product or service, learn how to market their product or service and write a business plan that they'll need to launch their business.

Entrepreneur students will be issued iPads with WiFi access, and will be allowed to participate in team competition in running their own company with **Junior Achievement** as well as participate in a district level Business Plan competition at the **University of Notre Dame**. Students will be afforded the opportunity to work with Notre Dame MBA mentors as they prepare for the Business Plan completion.

Although there are unit tests, this is a project driven program to include guest speakers and field trips, to include an annual field trip to Chicago in the spring.
